**Current Status of Negotiations: Search for Culturally Sensitive Assistance of Counsel for Respondent**

Attached are the documents I am going to file with the court to inform the Clerk of the Court that we are still searching for a lawyer who will be willing to provide you with culturally sensitive assistance of counsel legal advice.

You don't need to print them; I will bring a printed copy back for you; after having filed the original with the clerk. Its quite a few pages, but most of them you have read before; except probably for attachments; A, B and F.

A, B and F are the attached files that start and end with A: BB Perjury, B: Radical Honesty Amicus Order; and F: K Marshall.

So once I bring you the printed copies, please read them; even if you read two pages per day. Once you have finished reading them; you can let me know what you think about my suggestions that:

- I suggest that you give Karen Marshall more time to make a fully informed decision about whether she will agree to provide Clive and Ann with culturally sensitive assistance of counsel legal representation – i.e. recognizing your religious cultural values.

- In the meantime I will make enquiries to other attorneys in South Africa; to ascertain whether there are any lawyers in South Africa who are willing to provide you with culturally sensitive assistance of counsel legal advice in this matter.
- If we find an attorney who is willing to provide you with religious culturally sensitive assistance of counsel legal advice; then we can negotiate other issues further with such attorney; in terms of how to proceed.

I don't think there will be any South African attorneys willing to provide you with religious culturally sensitive assistance of counsel; but I may be wrong.

When I was looking for an attorney to provide me with cultural sensitive assistance of counsel legal advice; in my application to the Constitutional Court; I contacted all the Bar Associations and Law Societies and none of them were willing to provide me with culturally sensitive assistance of counsel legal advice.

In America if you are an Amish person with Amish religious cultural values; and you go to an attorney; who is not an Amish; or does not even know what Amish cultural values are; and you ask for religious culturally sensitive legal advice; they will ask you to explain to them what your Amish religious cultural values are; and then after they know your values; even if they disagree with your values and think you are weird; they will give you legal advice on how to fight for the rights of your small religious culture.

If we find an attorney who is willing to provide you with religious culturally sensitive assistance of counsel legal advice; then we can negotiate other issues further with such attorney; in terms of how to proceed.

If we cannot find an attorney who is willing to provide you with religious culturally sensitive assistance of counsel legal advice; then we can either (a) withdraw the case; (b) go to the Magistrate to ask his advice in terms of how to proceed; whether he will allow you to represent yourself; or what his suggestions are.
